

City of Cleveland Regular Meeting Minutes – January 6, 2020

The regular meeting was called to order at 5:30 p.m. by Mayor Don McCabe, Councilmembers present were Nancy Gens, Fred Danner and Glenn Beer.

No amendments to the agenda

A Motion was made by Danner and seconded by Beer to approve the December 2nd 2019 Minutes and Bills with the addition of Wolf Motors invoice for \$2182.18. Voting yes – all

A Motion was made by Gens and seconded by Danner to approve the Annual Appointments, Resolution #01-2020. Voting yes – all

A Motion was made by Beer and seconded by Gens to approve the regular council meeting schedule, Resolution #02-2020. Voting yes – all

The License and Fee schedule was discussed and determined that the city would charge five dollars a pet license for all animals. A Motion was made by Danner and seconded by Beer to approve Resolution #03-2020. Voting yes – all

Police Report – Chief Tiegs indicated that his department had a felony warrant arrest in December. Tiegs has been working with the School to plan a mock crash. A five-thousand-dollar grant was awarded to the police department on behalf of the Schmidt Foundation for a radar unit for the new squad car. Tiegs said he will be out of country from January 15th – 30th and the City Clerk will be handling Police administrative duties and all Investigatory questions will be fielded by the Bruce Collins from the Sheriff's Office if needed.

Public Works Report - Jared Holland indicated that the wing on the plow truck was damaged during snow removal. Holland started a claim through Community Insurance who will pass the info along to the League of Minnesota Insurance Trust. Crysteel of Lake Crystal, MN will be repairing the damage to the plow truck.

Liquor Report – Approved

A Motion was made by Danner and seconded by Beer to wave the 2nd reading of the amendment to Ordinance 9101.01. A Summary of that Ordinance will be published in official paper the Le Sueur County News on January 15th 2020, at that time the ordinance is in effect. Voting yes – all

The council was provided a list of policy recommendations from Troy Walsh. Troy Walsh is a representative with the League of Minnesota Cities and had a meeting with City staff to go over Lost Control Recommendations in December of 2019. The City Clerk indicated that he would be working with the League of Minnesota Cities in the future to come up with sample model policies that could potentially be adopted by the City of Cleveland.

A Motion was made by Gens and seconded by Beer to accept the 2019 Fire Relief donation of \$70,000 to the City, Resolution #04-2020. Voting yes –all

A Motion was made by Danner and seconded by Gens to approve the contractor pay estimate #1 for the 6th Street Extension Project in the amount of \$97,308.09. Voting yes – all

The City was contact by the Cleveland Public School ECFE teacher prior to the meeting. The school is in need of a temporary classroom for the ECFE program once a week from January to March. The council indicated that they would allow the school to use the council chambers for temporary classroom free of charge.

A Motion was made by Beer and seconded by Danner to Adjourn at 6:32 p.m. Voting yes – all
